## RULES FOR CLUB ENTRY

Clubs wishing to put on a Club Display must apply on the accompanying Entry Form for 2012. Space allocated to Club Displays will be limited. All applications will be reviewed and acceptance will be based upon the number and type of vehicles, relevance of the vehicles in the overall show and the quality of the display in previous years. Clubs accepted will be allocated space for **up to 10 cars**. Any Club requiring to display more than **ten vehicles** **must obtain prior permission** from the EDVVT. Vehicles on display must be of a show quality unless a vehicle is exhibited specifically to be a "before restoration" condition. If this is the case please indicate this on your entry form. The judges will take into account the quality of the vehicles when judging the club display.

All Clubs must agree to have their displays fully operational on **SATURDAY AND SUNDAY**, although the exhibits need not necessarily be the same vehicles for all three days. Club displays may be set up from midday on Thursday, 24<sup>th</sup> May and must be completed by 10 a.m. on Saturday, 26<sup>th</sup> May. Display set up and access to the show site will be subject to ground conditions. No tender vehicles or non-display vehicles will be permitted on the Club Display stand.

If a Club requires more than the ten allocated passes (and has made prior arrangements with the EDVVT for these) we rely on the Club Secretary's to organize these passes to good effect but please respect the original planned area agreed with the Organizers. Each Club may ask for one Tender Vehicle Pass.

Clubs are encouraged to use the Pageant to promote their activities and to recruit new members. The Club may sell such items as badges, tee-shirts and similar promotional material but the sale of parts or Autojumble IS NOT permitted within the display area. **Under no circumstances will 'vehicles for sale' be permitted on Club Stands.** All Clubs must display their name on a banner or nameboard. We encourage Clubs to provide a display in the main arena by arrangement.

### CLUB DISPLAY AWARDS

Each year awards are made to Clubs providing additional attractions in the form of varied and original displays. A team of judges will make the decisions which will be final and the prize winners will be announced on Sunday, 27<sup>th</sup> May. Club displays should remain static for the whole weekend. Entrants taking part on a Club Stand should position their vehicles on the Club Stand each day as their vehicles form the major part of the display being judged. Judging will take place during the course of the weekend. Cheques will be given to the prize winning Clubs, if possible in the arena, and the results published in the motoring press.

### PRIZES

**1<sup>st</sup> Prize:** £250.00

**2<sup>nd</sup> Prize:** £150.00

**3<sup>rd</sup> Prize:** £100.00

**Highly Commended:** £50.00 each (subject to there being sufficient Clubs of the required standard)

**ALL ENTRIES MUST BE RECEIVED BY THE EDVVT BEFORE 1st MAY 2012. ANY LATE ENTRIES WILL ONLY BE ISSUED WITH A £10 LATE ENTRY ADMIN FEE.**

**On Thursday, entry to the rally field will be from 12 noon and not before. Entry on Friday will be from 7 a.m. until 9 p.m. On Saturday and Sunday, EXHIBITORS MUST BE ON SITE BY 11 a.m. EXHIBITORS WILL NOT BE ADMITTED AFTER THIS TIME. No vehicles will be admitted without the necessary passes which MUST SHOW THE REGISTRATION DETAILS OF THAT VEHICLE. Health and Safety demand that vehicle movement on site is marshaled at all times. Vehicles will not be permitted to leave the site until 4.30 p.m. on Saturday and Sunday. In the evenings, the gates will be closed by security at 9 p.m. Entrants arriving after this time may park in the car park near to the main gate which is adjacent to the security Marquee. To avoid accidents, vehicle owners are requested not to drive on the showground after dark. The ropes and metal stakes can cause serious injury if pulled out of the ground by a moving vehicle in the dark. A speed limit of 5 mph must be observed on the Pageant site. All vehicles must be covered by Rally insurance and driven only by persons authorised to drive, with the appropriate licenses. **ALL PERSONS WHO DRIVE A MOTOR VEHICLE ON THIS SITE MUST HOLD A VALID FULL DRIVING LICENCE AND BE INSURED AGAINST THIRD PARTY LIABILITY.****

### COMMEMORATIVE MODELS

All pre-booked exhibitors will be given an attendance award - (a Pageant Model). No Models are given for Friday 25<sup>th</sup> May. **On ENTRY to the showground, exchange the Tear-off portion of your entry pass for a Model Voucher.** Exhibitors should present this **Model Voucher plus £3.00** at the EDVVT Model Marquee between 11 a.m. and 4 p.m. on either Saturday or Sunday in exchange for their Model. **MODELS WILL ONLY BE ISSUED WITH THIS MODEL VOUCHER. No voucher - No Model.**

### GROUND CONDITIONS

The movement of all vehicles on the Pageant site is subject to ground conditions. The London Borough of Enfield is tolerant of our use of the site, but we would ask all drivers to restrict their movements when the ground is wet. Remember that the EDVVT is liable to The London Borough of Enfield for the reinstatement of all damage to the grounds.

### FACILITIES

Exhibitors may camp or bring caravans on to the Pageant site but a pass is required, costing £20 for the duration of the show. The site has a permanent toilet block with free showers. There will be portable toilets available on many parts of the site. On-site catering facilities will be available. All public parking is free of charge on the opposite side of the park. Parking of surplus vehicles on the rally field will not be permitted.

### SAFETY

Please do not let your Club Stand/Vehicles encroach on to the roadway - it may well be you who needs an emergency vehicle.
